EdGE Afterschool Leads and Assistants support Mission Downeast initiatives that leverage education, leadership, experiential, outdoor activities, and mentoring-based programs to build youth engagement, aspirations, and resilience. This position works with a team of staff to facilitate EdGE afterschool program with a focus on students in grades K-8.

These are part-time positions averaging four to eight hours weekly at a rate of \$14.15 to \$22 per hour depending on experience.
