



2024 IMPACT AT-A-GLANCE

Across the Mission

- 13 programs that focus on education, community building, healthcare, and economic stability
- 3 Mission sites including the Colket Center in Northeast Harbor, the Downeast Campus in Cherryfield, and the 74-foot, steel-hulled *Sunbeam*
- 6 Maine counties received Mission services (Washington, Hancock, Waldo, Knox, Lincoln, and Cumberland)
- 54 community, health, and education partner organizations
- 2,971 hours of programming offered for students
- 113 volunteers donated more than 4,721 hours of their time

Island Health

- 14 island communities reached
- 148 flu and Covid vaccines given across 6 islands
- 24 community partners and healthcare providers offered services to island communities
- 1,966 health-related questions answered by text, email, and phone
- 434 in-person interactions with island residents
- 167 on island home visits and 107 clinic visits on the *Sunbeam*
- 202 blood pressure checks and 45 A1C screenings completed
- 15 labs drawn on the *Sunbeam*
- 10 check-in calls held with 10 island eldercare facilities and providers
- 5 food deliveries to islanders who experienced food insecurity

Island Outreach

- 16 island communities reached
- 89 island visits with 137 days spent on a Maine island
- 1,264 meals served and 2,539 cookies baked for island residents
- 17 partners provided enrichment and programs to islanders
- 2,055 in-person interactions with island residents
- 2,543 conversations by phone, text, and email
- 236 hours of programming with 7 island schools
- 3,600 push-ups, sit-ups, and jumping jacks completed by students
- 53 pieces submitted to the 18th volume of *The Island Reader* by residents of 14 islands
- 117 contractor bags of storm debris removed from 4 islands after the January 2024 storms



EdGE

- 1,884 hours of programming provided
- 814 students ages 5 to 14 attended EdGE programming
- 702 students attended in-school programming
- 557 students attended afterschool programming
- 268 students attended summer camp offered at three locations
- 150 families came to family programming
- 8 participating schools

Journey

- 70 participating students spanning ages 12 to 18
- 751 hours of programming offered including 11 college campus visits, 15 adventures, and 10 overnight trips
- 30 hours spent volunteering in the community
- 3 Journey students conducted 230 hours of peer mentoring
- 40 colleges applied to by graduating Journey students
- 2 participating schools

Mission Scholarships

- 80 students received \$229,500 in scholarships for the 2024-2025 academic year
- 97% of existing Scholars renewed their scholarships for the 2024-2025 academic year
- 64% of Scholars attended a college or university in Maine
- 18 Scholars graduated from their school in 2024
- 8 career and college prep workshops offered to students

Davis Maine Scholarship

- 3 partner colleges: Clark University, the University of New England, and Wheaton College
- 16 Scholars currently attending college
- 4 new scholarships awarded to high school students from Washington County
- 100 hours of one-on-one mentoring provided to Scholars
- 9 participating high schools in Hancock and Washington Counties
- 15 workshops and presentations held virtually and at high schools for prospective applicants

Food Security

- 4,907 total visits to pantry
- 864 unique households utilized the Mission's food security initiatives, 40% of which are enrolled in SNAP
- 270,686 pounds of food received by the pantry including 45,252 pounds of produce
- 4,174 pounds of food donated by community members
- 12 volunteers spent 1,200 hours helping in the pantry
- 225 gift cards given out at Thanksgiving

Housing Improvement

- 70 volunteers hailed from 11 states
- 22 projects completed on 9 properties including fixing stairs and decks, doing yard cleanup, replacing siding and skirting
- 2,800 hours of time donated to the community

Community Engagement

- 20 families supported through the Good Neighbor Fund
- 39 community events held for the public including open mic nights and yoga
- 3 resource fairs hosted with community partners
- 52 meals hosted by the Downeast Table of Plenty community group

Christmas Program

- 4,300 gifts distributed across five counties
- 425 children in Washington County, 47 children on unbridged islands, and 162 foster children received gifts
- 145 residents living in 13 nursing homes received gifts
- 7 volunteers chose, wrapped, and delivered presents for a total of 225 hours of donated time
- 3,000 handknit and crocheted items received from crafters across the country
