



2025 IMPACT AT-A-GLANCE

Across the Mission

- 13 programs that focus on education, community building, and healthcare
- 3 Mission sites including the Colket Center in Northeast Harbor, the Downeast Campus in Cherryfield, and the 74-foot, steel-hulled *Sunbeam*
- 6 Maine counties received Mission services (Washington, Hancock, Waldo, Knox, Lincoln, and Cumberland)
- 93 community, health, and education partner organizations
- 174 volunteers donated more than 5,015 hours of their time

Sunbeam

- 107 trips visiting 14 islands from Frenchman Bay to Casco Bay
- 1,265 visitors welcomed onboard
- 1,067 meals served and 2,428 cookies baked

Island Outreach

- 39 community events hosted on 9 islands
- 63 submissions to *The Island Reader* by residents of 13 islands
- 36 food boxes delivered to island residents facing food insecurity
- 15 partners provided enrichment and programs to islanders
- 10 island churches received funds to provide much needed repairs

Teaching & Learning Collaborative

- 9 island communities and 7 schools reached
- 74 school visits and activities with 47 island students
- 63 lessons taught
- 70 meetings with 8 teachers and 3 teacher aides
- 121 parent/guardian meetings and 18 school administrator meetings

Island Health

- 13 islands reached
- 181 patients had blood pressure checks, A1C screenings, and blood draws for testing
- 125 on island home visits and 80 clinic visits
- 97 vaccinations given across 6 island communities
- 15 community partners and healthcare providers offered services to island communities
- 10 meetings with eldercare providers on 8 islands



EdGE

- 528 students attended afterschool activities
- 273 students attended EdGE summer camp offered at three locations
- 547 students participated in Marion Kane Leadership programming
- 405 people attended family programming
- 7 schools participate in EdGE programming

Journey

- 93 participating students
- 71 meetings and experiences offered including 9 college visits, 17 adventures, and 6 overnight trips
- 8 guest speakers talked about their career experiences
- 3 family experiences hosted
- 2 schools participate in Journey programming

Mission Scholarships

- 82 students received \$246,000 in scholarships for the academic year
- 93% of students renewed their scholarship for the academic year
- 27 new Scholars entered their first semesters
- 15 Scholars graduated in 2025
- 72% of Scholars attend college in Maine



Davis Maine Scholarship

- 23 Davis Maine Scholars (19 in college and 4 in high school)
- 100+ hours of one-on-one mentoring provided to Scholars
- 100% of students are first-generation college students
- \$1,126,257 awarded for the academic year
- 3 partner colleges: Clark University, Wheaton College, and the University of New England
- 9 participating high schools in Hancock and Washington counties

Food Security

- 2,088 neighbors utilized the Mission's food security initiatives, 41% of which received SNAP
- 18,900 total visits with the average person visiting 9.12 times
- 290,139 pounds of food were received by the pantry
- 12,715 pounds of food were donated by community members
- 25 volunteers spent 746 hours volunteering for the pantry
- 1,194 hours in total the pantry was open



Community Engagement

- 468 events held on the Mission's Downeast Campus
- 652 attendees at 45 Mission-hosted events including ice skating, open climbing days, and the Mission Downeast Christmas Celebration
- 347 public events were hosted by partner organizations and community members including meals, open mics, talks, dances, and exercise classes
- 37 partner organizations hosted community events at Mission sites

Christmas Program

- 4,775 gifts given across Washington and Hancock counties and on outer islands
- 689 children received gifts including 180 children in foster care
- 159 elders living in 12 nursing homes received gifts

Housing Improvement

- 7 homes were improved and prepared for weatherization
- 81 total projects completed
- \$1,858 was the average cost of materials for updates
- 101 volunteers donated 3,212 hours of time to the community
